



#### Senior SAFE Programs Expand Smoke Alarm Installation Programs with Hard-Wired Alarms Program Launched in Billerica

On October 20, 2017, Billerica Town Manager John Curran, Billerica Fire Chief Thomas Conway and BCOA Director, Jean Bushnell launched an expansion of their Senior SAFE Program to include installation of hard-wired alarms, not just battery-operated ones.



This is a pilot program that joins programs in Dunstable, Fitchburg, Groton, Lincoln, Lunenburg, Pepperell and Westford. The first hard-wired alarm installation in Billerica also occurred on that date. The project is endorsed by the Fire Chiefs' Associa-

tion of Massachusetts and the Fire Prevention Association of Massachusetts.

Senior SAFE is funded by the State Department of Fire Services to help reduce fires in older adults' homes. The pilot group has received donations of alarms from Home Depot—Leominster, Kidde and the MA chapter of the International Association of Arson investigations (MA IAAI). Electricians donate their time to assist with installations when needed. The group is looking for additional sponsors and supporters.

Many people don't know that smoke alarms don't last forever; they need to be replaced every 10 years. The sensing technology wears out over time and cannot be relied upon in an emergency after that time.

#### Recipe of the Month: Dark Chocolate-Pecan Toffee

#### Ingredients:

1 cup unsalted butter, cut up, plus more for baking sheet 1 1/2 cups pecan halves, divided 3/4 cup granulated sugar 1/4 cup packed light brown sugar

1/2 tsp. kosher salt 1/2 tsp. vanilla extract

1 3.5 oz. dark chocolate bar, chopped 3/4 tsp. large flaked sea salt (such as Maldon)

#### **Directions:**

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. Butter a rimmed baking sheet.

- 2. Spread pecan halves on a second rimmed baking sheet and toast just until fragrant, 7 to 8 minutes; cool. Arrange 1 cup toasted pecans, flat side down, in a single layer on prepared baking sheet, leaving a 2-to 3-inch border along sides of baking sheet. Chop remaining 1/2 cup pecans; set aside.
- 3. Combine butter, sugars, salt, vanilla and 1/4 cup water in a medium saucepan. Cook over medium-low heat, stirring constantly, until mixture reaches 290 degrees Fahrenheit, 18 to 20 minutes. Slowly pour hot caramel mixture over pecans, making sure to fully cover each nut and leaving the 2– to 3-inch border around baking sheet.
- 4. Sprinkle chocolate evenly over toffee; let sit until slightly melted. Spread chocolate, in an even layer, with a small rubber scraper or offset spatula. Sprinkle with chopped pecans and sea salt. Let stand 20 minutes, then refrigerate until cool and set 40 to 45 minutes. Break into small pieces.
